BACKGROUND:

From our mission statement, the Izaak Walton League of America (IWLA) is “to conserve, restore, and promote the sustainable use and enjoyment of our natural resources, including soil, air, woods, waters, and wildlife.” Part of our longstanding mission includes education.

The League has long realized that education is important to the future of our environment. By raising public awareness about conservation issues, the League can help protect natural resources for future generations.

Established in 2021, the IWLA Harry Enstrom Environmental Scholarship is being formed to encourage, promote and recognize conservation leadership among future natural resource managers and professionals.

The scholarship is designed to support HS graduates pursuing environmental/conservation higher education and to support undergraduates from recognized conservation or environmental-related degree programs. Programs may include, but not limited to:

- **Environmental science/engineering/education**
- **Natural resource management**
- **Forestry**
- **Wildlife**
- **Fisheries**
- **Parks and recreation**
- **Range management**
- **Other natural and earth sciences**

QUALIFICATIONS:

IWLA Harry Enstrom Environmental Scholarship may be presented to no more than two students in the Greene, Washington and Fayette County area. Each scholarship includes a \$1000.00 scholarship, an engraved plaque and a one year IWLA Membership.

Category #1 – Current High School Senior

- 1. Senior maintaining a minimum 3.0 GPA.**
- 2. Pursuing higher education in a before mentioned category.**

Category #2 – University Undergraduate Student

- 1. Undergraduate in a recognized conservation or environmental-related degree program maintaining a 3.0 GPA.**
- 2. Be scheduled to enroll as a full-time undergraduate student for the following fall semester/quarter.**

APPLICATION OPENING/DEADLINE:

The scholarship opening date is February 15th and your completed application must be postmarked no later than April 15th.

Note: IWLA reserves the right to extend this deadline on an annual basis

APPLICATION PROCEDURES:

Complete the IWLA Harry Enstrom Environmental Scholarship Application Form, including the written requirements. Enclose one letter of personal reference from your High School or University. Then mail the completed packet to IWLA Harry Enstrom Chapter, PO Box 91, Clarksville, Pennsylvania 15322. Attention Scholarship Committee

You will receive a confirmation acknowledging receipt of your application. If you do not receive acknowledgment within two to three weeks, please call 740-739-0193 to confirm receipt of your application packet.

SELECTION PROCESS:

Applicants will be evaluated based upon their knowledge of conservation/environmental issues and their commitment to be a future conservation leader. Each submitted application will be screened by the Harry Enstrom BOG Scholarship Committee. The selection of recipients will be completed no later than the end of the month of May. All applicants will be notified as to their final decision soon after.

IWLA Harry Enstrom Environmental Scholarship recipients will be announced and recognized at our July General Meeting. And scholarships will be awarded either to the student or the students university account no later than the beginning of the fall semester/quarter.

SCHOLARSHIP CONDITIONS:

The scholarship may be used for tuition, fees, books, room and board, or other research expenses related to applicant's major. Depending on the situation, payments will be made directly to the college/university in the name of the student or the student directly with a caveat requiring proof of expenditures. If to the university, the student's identification number will be required only if selected.
